Whereas I have provided for my daughter Eliza Ann our

Abergavenny aforesaid Gentleman do make this my last will and  
Testament I desire that my body may be buried with as little expence  
as common decency will admit. I desire that all my debts may be  
paid I will and bequeath unto my eldest Son Ralph Hansby his  
heir and assigns all and every of my free farm Rents in Glamorganshire I  
will and bequeath unto my dearly beloved Wife all my plate and  
Linen I will and bequeath all the rest and residue of my properties of  
every kind and nature whatsoever unto my two Sons the aforesaid  
Ralph Hansby and Michael William Hansby to be equally divided  
between them subject however to the payment of an annuity of eight  
five pounds p annum to my dearly beloved Wife during her life to be  
paid to her by half yearly instalments commencing on the day of my  
death and which is part of the Marriage Settlement bearing date on  
the twentieth day of June in the year 1795 (ninety five) - which  
annuity together with another annuity of forty five pounds p annum  
which is settled and to be secured to her during her life out the interest  
of the principal sum of twelve hundred pounds vested in John  
Jones Esquire of Caerphilly and my Son Ralph Hansby as  
Trustees for that and other purposes will make the amount of three  
annual p annum to be one hundred and thirty pounds p annum being  
in lieu of the Marriage Settlement I appoint my dearly beloved  
Wife my Son Ralph Hansby and my friend William Wood of the  
Brunswick Square Bristol Merchant to be Executors of this my last  
will and Testament given under my hand and seal this twentieth
